		In Matthew is it s spiritual skill that is given by God's sovereign grace to the repentant of heart. (13:11-16) In Mark is it s spiritual skill that requires faith in, fellowship with, and following of the Lord Jesus Christ. (4:3, 9-12)

	>	The	e word in Greek is ὑπακούω (hupakouw) and a similar word in Hebrew is ײַנְיִשׁ (shemah).				
	>	➤ The word basically means to hear or listen but the meaning in most contexts is to willingly place oneself under what another says!
