Asking the Hard Question: Is conscious <u>FAITH</u> in Jesus necessary for salvation?

Inclusivism says: <u>NO</u>! Those who have never heard of Jesus, but sincerely respond in faith to God based on the light they have will be saved on the basis of the work of Jesus.



Four Arguments Determine Inclusivism

#1 The "FAITH Principle" Sets a Standard Low Enough for Those Who Have Never Heard of Jesus to Be Saved...or Does It?

Inclusivists argue...

- > A GENERAL faith in a generic God is sufficient to save. Hebrews 11:6
 - 1) God looks at the **<u>DIRECTION</u>** of the heart, not the doctrine in the head.
 - 2) Saving faith is measured by **SINCERITY**, not content.

Exclusivists answer from the Bible...

- > A SPECIFIC faith in the particular person, the Lord Jesus Christ, is required to be saved. Hebrews 12:2
- Saving faith as taught in the Bible has three basic elements:
 - 1) Knowing the TRUTH2) Affirming it is TRUE3) Choosing to TRUST
- Saving faith comes by **HEARING** and hearing by the word of God being preached to the lost. Romans 10:17

- Saving faith is never **<u>SEPARATED</u>** from special revelation concerning the Son of God, the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - 1) *Hebrews 11:6* is not sufficient for salvation in the OT and certainly not since God's final revelation of Himself in the coming of His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. *Hebrews 11:1-3*
 - 2) None of the "Heroes of the Faith" in *Hebrews 11* placed their faith in God apart from the special revelation of Himself and the promise of the coming Seed—the Man of promise!
