Lesson 2 • Colossians 4:7-9

➤ The Book of Colossians is like a GPS (God's Positioning System) for finding our satisfaction in the supremacy and sufficiency of Christ. Satisfaction is guaranteed in your personal life when Christ is all and in all areas of your life.

>	Colossians 4:7-18 reminds us that our ministry to others is the overflow of our relationship with Christ. 12 people are mentioned by name. Each one
	sought to make their mark for eternity. We are following in the footsteps of those who fulfilled their ministries, so we too can make our mark
	for eternity!

Follow in the Footsteps of Tychicus and \_\_\_\_\_! Colossians 4:7-9

- **I.** A Man Who Made His Mark: Tychicus = "Fortunate (Fortuitous)"
  - > Tychicus is mentioned 5 times in Scripture that covers a decade of ministry in places all over the Roman Empire.

## Tychicus Was a Trustworthy Traveler

1) The churches of Asia *trusted him* to carry their financial contribution to the believers in Jerusalem.

Acts 20:4 (AD 56)

 Paul *trusted him* to carry his letters to the Colossians, Ephesians, Laodiceans, and Philemon.

**Colossians 4:7-9; Ephesians 6:21** (c. AD 60-62 = 4-6 years later)

- 3) Paul trusted him to communicate the circumstances of his imprisonment, confront the false teachers at Colossae, and comfort the hearts of the Colossians!
- Paul trusted him to replace Titus in Crete.
   Titus 3:12 (c. AD 62-64 = 1-2 years later)



5) Paul *trusted him* to replace Timothy in Ephesus at the end of his life... *and possibly deliver his very last letter!*2 *Timothy 4:12* (c. AD 64- 67 = 5-7 years later or less if Paul was martyred in the mid 60's)

1)	Christ as your Savior and Lord. "in the Lord"
	Stay on track with a <i>growing relationship</i> with the Lord that is fed by God's Word and fueled by God's Spirit in corporate worship and daily time with the Lord. <i>Colossians 1:5-7</i>
2)	in Christ through community with other believers. "a beloved brother"
	Stay on track with <i>real fellowship</i> with other believers in a GrowGroup, Discovery Class, and Grow 1-on-1. <i>Colossians</i> 2:6-7; 2:1-2; 3:12-17; 1:28-29
3)	Christ by loving and serving others in our church and community. "a faithful minister (= servant)"
	Stay on track with <i>outstanding membership</i> in our church by getting involved in church ministry and community projects. <i>Colossians</i> 1:3-5; 2:5; 3:1-4
4)	with Christ to the lost here at home and around the world. "a fellow servant (= slave)"
	Stay on track with <b>whole-hearted partnership</b> sharing the gospel through daily opportunities, our community outreaches, and the World Outreach Celebration and Faith Promise Giving. <i>Colossians 1:6-8; 4:2-6</i>
De	velop a track record of trust ! (4:8-9)
7	rust is to human relationships what faith is to gospel living. It is the beginning place, the foundation upon which more can be built. Where trust is, love can flourish. ~Barbara Smith
1)	Always model the message—it is always hardest at home!
2)	Never outgrow being faithful in the little things—the greatest in the Kingdom is a servant of all!
3)	Keep taking next steps to KNOW-GROW-SHOW-GO with Christ—God has not called us to selfishness but service!
4)	Be faithful to do anything, anytime, anywhere, at any cost—it simply takes a Christ-like manner, a biblical message, and a servant's mindset.
5)	Developing a track record of trust is one of the greatest ways to encourage the hearts of God's leaders and people.
