

ReFocus: God Is Big Enough and Small Enough

Lesson 21 • Job 33-37

When We Lose Focus in the Midst of Undeserved Adversity and Unfair Criticism, We Need Someone to Intervene and Help Us <u>REFOCUS!</u>

Job 32–37 records the intervention by Elihu, that includes his introduction (32) and his instruction (33-37) of Job and his miserable comforters in four speeches.

Speeches	Job Loses Focus		Elíhu Seeks to ReFocus
First (Ch 33)	Why doesn't God respond to me?	Implication: God is uncaring!	God Is Freely Sovereign
Second (Ch 34)	Why doesn't God relieve me?	Implication: God is unjust!	God Is Unfailingly Just
Third (Ch 35)	Why doesn't God reward me?	Implication: God is unrighteous!	God Is Absolutely Righteous
Fourth (Ch 36-37)	Why doesn't God resolve this?	Implication: God is unworthy!	God Is Supremely Worthy

REFOCUS: God Is Bigger and Smaller Than We Can Possibly Understand!

1. God is FREELY sovereign and does not have to answer to us for anything. Chapter 33

Job's Loss of Focus (33:8-11) Why doesn't God respond to me? Implication: God is uncaring!

Elihu Seeks to ReFocus (33:12-30)

- God is freely <u>SOVEREIGN</u>, therefore, He does not have to give an account of Himself to us just because we demand answers! (12-13)
- 2) God is freely sovereign, therefore, He can choose to SPEAK in many ways at different times. (14-28)

"We can ignore even pleasure. But pain insists upon being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our conscience, but shouts in our pains: it is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world." ~C. S. Lewis

3) God is freely sovereign and **CARING**, *therefore*, He is always speaking to us for His glory and our good!

Job's Opportunity to Respond: Job fails to answer for the first time and chooses to continue to listen and gain wisdom. (33:31-33)

ReFocus: God is always freely speaking to us in our suffering, so the question is...

Are we listening, trusting, and following?

2. God is <u>UNFAILINGLY</u> just and can never do wrong even it seems that way to us. Chapter 34

Elihu's Reminder to Be Discerning and Choose Wisdom (34:1-4)

Job's Loss of Focus (34:5-9) Why doesn't God relieve me? Implication: God is unjust!

Elihu Seeks to ReFocus (34:10-30)

1) God is unfailingly JUST, therefore, He never does anything that would pervert justice! (10-12)

- 2) God is unfailingly just and **MERCIFUL**, *therefore*, even our next breath is a gift of His mercy! (13-15)
- 3) God is unfailingly just and ALMIGHTY, therefore, no one can accuse Him of being unjust or overthrow His rule! (16-30)

Elihu's Diagnosis of Job's Problem (34:31-37)

- 1) You are trying to **CONTROL** your suffering and God by demanding that the just Judge meet your personal demands!
- 2) You are speaking words <u>WITHOUT</u> knowledge or wisdom. You have forgotten that running the universe is above your pay grade!
- 3) You deserve to be <u>JUDGED</u> to the limit for talking like an unbeliever and implying that God is unjust because you say so!

ReFocus: God is always unfailingly just to us even in our suffering, so the question is...

Are we willing to stop complaining to God and start trusting God?

3. God is ABSOLUTELY RIGHTEOUS and does not need us to complete Himself. Chapter 35

Job's Loss of Focus (35:1-3) Why doesn't God reward me? Implication: God is unrighteous!

Elihu Seeks to ReFocus (35:4-8)

- 1) God is absolutely righteous, *therefore*, <u>NOTHING</u> we do or don't do can ever harm Him or help Him! (4-7)
- 2) God is absolutely righteous, therefore, EVERYTHING we do or don't do and how it impacts others does matter. (8)

Elihu's Diagnosis of Job's Problem (35:9-16)

- 1) You are becoming self-centered, suffering-obsessed, relief-oriented, and proud. (9, 12)
- 2) You need to become God-centered, wisdom-obsessed, relationship-oriented, and humble. (10-12)
- 3) You are too focused on your own timetable and not patiently waiting for God to come through in His own time. (13-16)

ReFocus: God is always absolutely right in what He is doing in our suffering, so the question is...

Are we willing to wait for Him to help and heal us on His timetable not ours?

4. God is <u>SUPREMELY</u> worthy of our trust in life's storms even when we see no end to it. Chapters 36-37

Elihu's Request for Job's Patience (36:1-4)

Elihu's Defense of God's Purposes (36:5-16)

Elihu's Diagnosis of Job's Problem (36:17-23) Why doesn't God resolve this? Implication: God is unworthy!

Elihu's Doxology of God's Perfections (36:24-37:20)

"There is no attribute of God more comforting to His children than the doctrine of divine sovereignty." ~Charles Spurgeon

Our God Is Storm Controller Not a Storm Chaser!

God is sovereign over **thunderstorms** (37:1-5), **snowstorms** (37:6-10), **rainstorms** (37:11-13), and over **all storms**, yet we are **clueless** and **powerless!** (37:14-20)

Elihu's Deferral to God's Presence (37:21-24)

God is sovereign over life's storms including yours – He is awesome and almighty, so fear Him with a humble heart! (37:24)

ReFocus: God is always supremely worthy of our trust and obedience, so the question is...

Are we willing to humble ourselves and fear Him more than the storms of life?
