# Vengeance Is Mine!

### An Angry Man Gets Even:

Samson, the "deliverer," never fights a battle for God's <u>HONOR</u> but only for his own REVENGE against the Philistines.

### A Three-Act Drama of Revenge:

### Act 1: Samson's Personal REVENGE! Judges 15:1-8

### Getting Even:

- Samson avenges his ruined MARRIAGE. vs. 1-5
- Samson avenges his wife's <u>DEATH</u>. vs. 6-8

#### The Cycle of Revenge:

When you try to seek revenge for the <u>WRONGS</u> done to you, you set in motion a never-ending cycle of revenge. That's why revenge belongs to the Lord.

Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." Romans 12:19 (ESV)

#### The Christlike Responsibility:

We are to <u>BLESS</u> those who persecute us and  $\underline{PRAY}$  for those (not prey on those) who mistreat us.

"But I tell you who hear me: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." ~Jesus, Luke 6:27-28

# Act 2: Samson's Amazing VICTORY! Judges 15:9-17

#### Making Donkeys of the Philistines:

- The Judeans ACCOMMODATED the enemy because of fear and sin. vs. 9-13
- Samson DEFEATED the enemy with the jawbone of a donkey. vs. 14-17

#### Victory On Jawbone Hill:

When Samson names the place of victory <u>RAMATH LEHI</u> ("Hill of the Jawbone"), he commemorates himself, but not his God.

# Act 3: Samson's Greatest PRAYER! Judges 15:18-20

### Samson's Greatest Prayer Comes After His Greatest Victory!

And yet, Samson's prayer is a curious mixture of both <u>FAITH</u> in God and selfcentered COMPLAINT.

#### God's Grace to Samson:

- God supplied Samson with WATER. vs. 18-19
- God established Samson as JUDGE. vs. 20

#### Life Lessons from a Flawed Hero:

- Missed OPPORTUNITIES are often the result of spiritual compromise.
- God's anointing on an individual is not always His stamp of <u>APPROVAL</u> on a person's conduct.
- There's always HOPE for modern-day "Samsons" with God's grace.
