A Life That Counts

A Tombstone View of My Life:

If you were to write the epitaph on your tombstone, what would it say?

- Keeping the faith requires ENDURANCE to the end. ≻
- Keeping the faith has OPPONENTS who want to defeat us. ≻

2. Anticipates the REWARD!

Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing. 2Timothy 4:8 NKJV

What Is the Promised Reward?

It is the victor's "crown of RIGHTEOUSNESS."

The Triumphant Epitaph of a Life That Counted:

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." ~Apostle Paul, 2Timothy 4:7 NKJV

3. Presents the SACRIFICE!

For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure is at hand. 2Timothy 4:6 NKJV

A Life That Counts:

1. Keeps the FAITH!

I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. 2Timothy 4:7 NKJV

What Is the "Faith" We Are to Keep?

The "faith" is not faith in ourselves, or in any mere person—it is faith in JESUS CHRIST and His WORD.

How Is Keeping the Faith Like a Fight and a Race?

Keeping the faith is HARD. \geq

What Is the Sacrifice of a Life That Counts?

It is presenting your life as a "LIVING SACRIFICE" to the Lord.

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. Romans 12:1 NKJV

Reflecting On Christ's Sacrifice through Communion:
