Lesson 4 • Colossians 4:10-11

Colossians 4:7-18 reminds us that our ministry to others is the overflow of our relationship with Christ. 12 people are mentioned by name. Each one sought to make their mark for eternity. We are *following in the footsteps of those who fulfilled their ministries*, so we too can make our mark for eternity!

A Man Who Made His Mark: John Mark (Marcus) = "The LORD is gracious" and "Warrior"

- Mark is mentioned in 8 or 9 passages of the Bible: Acts 12:12, 25; 13:5, 13; 15:37-39; Colossians 4:10; 2Timothy 4:11; Philemon 24; 1Peter 5:13; Mark 14:51(?)
- > He enjoyed the privilege of serving alongside three of the most influential men in the NT: *Peter, Barnabas, and Paul*
- > He is Paul's only co-worker, other than Luke, who wrote one of the four gospels!
- > He shares the honor with Timothy, Luke, and Tychicus of being mentioned by Paul at the end of his life. 2Timothy 4:9-12
- Mark is one of God's _

Mark's Famous Failure in Life

1) Potential Success: ______ as useable & potentially useful by cousin Barnabas and Saul (= Paul). Acts 12:25; 13:1-13

Mark Goes Along as...

- A *helper* who meets their needs and serves them as they carry out their mission.
- An apprentice who is learning what needs to be done from his mentors with no concern for personal dignity or worth.
- A discipler who takes care of the scrolls (OT Scriptures & collected "sayings of Jesus") and teaches new converts. (Luke 1:2; Acts 26:16)
