How to Advance God's Kingdom on Your Knees

1. Pray _____ ♦ *"Epaphras...a slave of Christ Jesus..."*

As a slave of Christ, he saw life from his Master's perspective and was concerned with seeing his master's interests advanced more than his own. In fact, His Master's interests were his own interests!

"And how bold and free we then become in his presence, freely asking according to his will, sure that he's listening. And if we're confident that he's listening, we know that what we've asked for is as good as ours." 1John 5:14-15 (The Message)

- _____: Resist false teaching and false living. (Col. 1:21-23)
- _____: Become fully devoted Christ followers. (Col. 1:28, 9-14)
- _____: Stay satisfied with the sufficiency of Christ and His Gospel. (Col. 2:8-10)
- _____: Do what God has revealed in His Word to be His will. (Col. 3:16; 4:2-6)
