Lesson Two • Habakkuk 1:12-2:4 God, Are You Really Fair?

Three Thoughts Concerning Our Second Tough Question:

- The question, "God, are You really fair?" germinates in the soil of our <u>PERSPECTIVE</u> on life and God.
- The problem is our perspective is not always the same as <u>REALITY</u>, especially in matters of faith and eternity.
- The starting point in answering the question, "God, are You really fair?" is <u>ADMITTING</u> that we have formed some opinions about God that may be inaccurate.

When You Have Serious Doubts About the Fairness of God ...

1. EXPOSE the Wrong Perspective! Habakkuk 1:12-13

Habakkuk's Wrong Perspective to Expose:

God has abandoned <u>FAIRNESS</u> in the coming judgment of His people.

Habakkuk Rehearses the Truth of God's Unchangeable Character:

- ➢ God is <u>ETERNAL</u>.
- ➤ God is <u>HOLY</u>.
- ➢ God is <u>SOVEREIGN</u>.
- ➢ God is <u>FAITHFUL</u>.

2. EMBRACE the Right Perspective! Habakkuk 1:12-17

A Right Perspective to Embrace:

God has <u>ORDAINED</u> difficult circumstances for the life of every Christ-follower!

Habakkuk Questions God's Use of the Babylonians:

- Why would God <u>EMPLOY</u> a people of iniquity? vs. 12-13
- > Why would God <u>ENDORSE</u> a people of injustice? vs. 14-15
- > Why would God EXCUSE a people of idolatry? vs. 16-17

Habakkuk's Question: God, are You really fair?

God's Answer:

Tough times are coming, so get ready and TRUST ME!

I will stand my watch and set myself on the rampart, and watch to see what He will say to me, and what I will answer when I am corrected. Then the Lord answered me and said: "Write the vision and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it. For the vision is yet for an appointed time; but at the end it will speak, and it will not lie. Though it tarries, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry. Behold the proud, his soul is not upright in him; but the just shall live by his faith." Habakkuk 2:1-4

Lessons of Hope to Live By:

- Commit your <u>THOUGHTS</u> to God. vs. 2:1
- Refuse to <u>GIVE UP</u> on God. vs. 2:2-3
- Live by <u>FAITH</u> in God. vs. 2:4
