Living On Mission

The Gospel Demands His Mission Become Our Mission:

Therefore we must LIVE ON MISSION as fully-devoted followers of Jesus Christ.

Living On Mission:

1. Living On Mission Means Going to Great NEED! *Matthew 10:5-10*

Going to Great Need:

Go to people in great need and SHOW Christ to them.

“Do not go into the way of the Gentiles, and do not enter a city of the Samaritans. But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And as you go, preach, saying, ‘The kingdom of heaven is at hand.’ Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons.”
Matthew 10:5-8

As You Go to People in Great Need:

Proclaim the Good News of the GOSPEL of Jesus Christ.

For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. Romans 1:16

2. Living On Mission Means Going in Great DANGER! *Matthew 10:11-25*

Going in Great Danger:

Jesus sends us out as SHEEP in the midst of WOLVES.

“Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves. Therefore be wise as serpents and harmless as doves.” Matthew 10:16

The Dangers of Living On Mission:

- When OPPOSED, remember to depend on God’s presence.
- When BETRAYED, remember the value of endurance to the end.
- When HATED, remember it is for the sake of Jesus’ name.
- When PERSECUTED, remember you are following in Jesus’ footsteps.

3. Living On Mission Means Going with Great FAITH! *Matthew 10:26-31*

Going with Great Faith:

FEAR will tempt you, but the FATHER will take care of you.

“Therefore do not fear them...” Matthew 10:26

“And do not fear those...” Matthew 10:28

“Do not fear therefore...” Matthew 10:31

No Need to Fear When You Know...

- God’s sovereignty is our SAFETY.
- God’s love is our SECURITY.
- God’s presence is our SATISFACTION.

Do we really want to be like Jesus? Are we willing to live on mission with Jesus?
Are we willing to go to great need in great danger with great faith?
