# Summer in the Psalms

Lesson Seven • Psalm 26 **Overcoming Mistreatment** 

#### Warning! When It Comes to Mistreatment:

Don't become BITTER and don't BACKSLIDE!

Vindicate me, O LORD, for I have walked in my integrity. I have also trusted in the LORD; I shall not slip. Psalm 26:1

### 3. Refuse the Temptation to GET EVEN!

I have not sat with idolatrous mortals, nor will I go in with hypocrites. I have hated the congregation of evildoers, and will not sit with the wicked. Psalm 26:4-5

#### In the Midst of Mistreatment:

- Listen to the counsel of the GODLY, not the ungodly. Psalm 1
- $\geq$ Repay wrong with LOVE, not revenge. Rom. 12:19-20; 13:10

### 4. Maintain Your <u>RELATIONSHIP</u> with God!

I will wash my hands in innocence; so I will go about Your altar, O LORD, that I may proclaim with the voice of thanksgiving, and tell of all Your wondrous works. Psalm 26:6-7

#### How to Do Right When You've Been Done Wrong:

### 1. Open Your <u>HEART</u> Before the Lord!

Examine me, O LORD, and prove me; try my mind and my heart. Psalm 26:2

#### When You've Been Done Wrong, Ask God to:

- SEARCH your heart. Ps. 139:23-24  $\geq$
- $\geq$ PURIFY your heart. James 1:2-4

# 5. Be Faithful in Corporate WORSHIP!

LORD, I have loved the habitation of Your house, and the place where Your glory dwells. Psalm 26:8

# 6. Keep Walking in Your INTEGRITY!

Do not gather my soul together with sinners, nor my life with bloodthirsty men, in whose hands is a sinister scheme, and whose right hand is full of bribes. But as for me, I will walk in my integrity. Redeem me and be merciful to me. Psalm 26:9-11

The Result of Doing Right When You've Been Done Wrong: You will STAND on level ground instead of SLIDING on slippery terrain.
