# Are You Burdened for the Eternal Destiny of the People Around You?

We need to be **HEARTBROKEN** for the hell-bent!

9:1-3 ~ Paul's **PERSONAL PAIN** over the condemnation of his people, Israel. 10:1 ~ Paul's **PASSIONATE PRAYER** for the salvation of his people, Israel 11:1 ~ Paul's **POSITIVE PROOF** of God's future restoration of His people, Israel

# Those Burdened for the Eternal Destiny of Others

- 1. BELIEVE the Reality of the Burden. Romans 9:3
  - "...accursed and cut off from Christ...[are] my brothers, my kinsmen according to the flesh."
  - ➤ The reality is that everyone who is <u>WITHOUT</u> Christ is under the curse of God's eternal wrath. Galatians 1:8-9; 1Corinthians 16:22; Romans 1:18; 2:5, 8; 3:5
  - We will never be burdened for the lost until we <u>TRULY BELIEVE</u> they are lost without Christ.
- 2. SPEAK with the Sincerity of the Burden. Romans 9:1

"I am speaking the truth in Christ—I am not lying; my conscience bears me witness in the Holy Spirit—"

- A sincere burden is <u>SHARED</u> with others.
- ➤ A sincere burden is shared like CHRIST would share—He too is heartbroken for the hell bent!
  - 1) Paul's burden for the Jewish people in their unbelief was a Christ-like burden. Matthew 23:37: Luke 23:34
  - 2) Paul's burden for the Jewish people in their unbelief is a *Christian* burden.
- A sincere burden is shared with a CLEAR conscience that is confirmed by the Holy Spirit.
- 3. BLEED with the *Intensity* of the Burden. Romans 9:2

"that I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my brothers, my kinsmen according to the flesh."



- We should bleed with great sorrow and unceasing anguish in our hearts.
- We should be so heartbroken for those who are hell-bent that we would be willing to <u>SACRIFICE</u> everything to see them come to Christ.

#### Wrong Ways to Deal with the Tension of Our Intense Burden for the Lost

- 1) QUESTION God's love or justice regarding His righteous judgment of their sin and unbelief.
- 2) CHANGE God's character or His Word so it lines up with what "my God" would be like or would do.
- 3) GRUDGINGLY/RELUCTANTLY accept who God is and what His Word says about the lost, but wish there was no hell and focus on how if you were God you would do it differently

## What Do All of These Ways of Dealing with the Tension Have in Common?

They all three look at the tension from a <u>HUMAN</u> perspective that implies we are some how we know better than God does how to deal with the eternal destiny of people.

## What Is the Right Way to Deal with the Tension of Our Intense Burden for the Lost?

Look to the CROSS of Christ that neither lessens the sinfulness of people nor the holiness of God.

Paul wishes that he could (but knows that can't) sacrifice himself as a substitute to save his loved ones!

In other words, he deals with the tension according to the GOSPEL of Christ!

#### Is Our Love for God and Others So Great that...

We are willing to stay out of heaven for the saved and go to hell for the unsaved?

#### **4. ACT on the Responsibility of the Burden.** Romans 9:1-3; 10:1; 11:1-2

"I am speaking the truth in Christ... for the sake of my brothers, my kinsmen according to the flesh ..."

"Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved."

"I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! For I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin. God has not rejected his people whom he foreknew."

#### Our Burden Should Result in ACTION...

- SHARING it with others with sincerity and intensity.
- > PRAYING sincerely and intensely for God to save the lost.
- > WITNESSING to the lost with sincerity and intensity about the reality of eternal judgment and salvation in Christ.
- GROWING in sincerity and intensity in light of the reality of eternal judgment and eternal salvation.

## Saul the Hater of Christians

Cursed by God and Cut Off from Christ Killing Christians A Hard Heart toward the Gospel After the sovereign Savior saved Saul on the Damascus Road...

Paul's burden grew over a 20-year period as it was Word-fed, Spirit-led, and gospel-focused!

## **Paul the Lover of the Lost**

Saved by God in Christ Willing to die for the Unsaved A Broken Heart for the Hell-bent
