ALTERED: Encounters with Jesus

Lesson Eight • Luke 7:36-50 Pharisee and Prostitute

Pharisee and Prostitute Encounter Jesus

This encounter shows that Jesus is a Savior who loves to <u>FORGIVE</u> sin and forgiven sinners <u>LOVE</u> Jesus.

Encounter with Jesus in Three Scenes

Meaning of the Story

- The story does not deal with the <u>AMOUNT</u> of sin in a person's life but the awareness of that sin in the heart (vs. 44-46).
- The point of the story is that the woman <u>LOVED</u> so much because her many sins were forgiven (vs. 47).

Scene 3: Table TALK about the Savior

Astonished at Jesus

- > Jesus has authority and power to forgive our <u>SINS</u> (vs. 48).
- > Jesus has authority and power to give us <u>PEACE</u> (vs. 50).

The Host Who Forgot His Manners

A Pharisee <u>INVITES</u> Jesus to a dinner party at his house (vs. 36).

Lesson from Dinner with Jesus

Those who are <u>FORGIVEN</u> much, <u>LOVE</u> much.

A life of love for Jesus is the grateful response of a sinner who has found true forgiveness in Jesus Christ.

Simon the Dharisse looks at the sinful woman and inwardly convolution

Simon the Pharisee looks at the sinful woman and inwardly conveys the <u>SCORN</u> of his contempt (vs. 39).

Interruption at Dinner

Story of Our Sin Debt

Jesus tells a short story of two <u>DEBTORS</u> to illustrate our sin debt (vs. 40-43).

COMMUNION Remember with Grateful Hearts the Sin Debt Paid by Jesus

Followers of Jesus Christ (those who trust Christ for salvation, identify with Christ in baptism, and commit to Christ's body in membership of a local church of like faith and practice) are invited to participate in Communion located at the four tables in the auditorium. You may take the bread and cup back to your seat to eat and drink. The bread and juice represent the body and blood of Jesus when He died on the Cross and reminds us who our Lord is, what He has done for us, is doing for us, and will yet do for us when He returns. Come, Lord Jesus, come!
