How Do You Want to Be Remembered?

2 Timothy 4:6-8

In a way you are living your epitaph at this time a life that others will remember you.

Paul is coming the end of his life. He's looking death in the face.

Just before he is executed Paul is in a Roman prison. And yet, after 30 years of serving the Lord he writes to Timothy these verses in 2 Timothy 4:6-8.

Three Questions to Be Asked Based on Paul's Words

1. What Kind Of DEPARTURE Will You Have? (vs. 6)

View your life as a <u>SACRIFICE</u> to God: "already being poured out as a drink offerina"

Be remembered as living your life in such a way that you can look back and say, "I poured out my life as a sacrifice to God!"

View your death as a <u>DEPARTURE</u> to God: "the time of my departure has come"

Be remembered as a person who was willing to offer your life as a living sacrifice to the Lord with nothing held back.

2. What Kind LEGACY Will You Leave? (vs. 7)

Do What Paul Did

AT NO TIME stop fighting for Jesus Christ: "I have fought the good fight"

Be remembered as one who kept going on for Christ no matter what.

> <u>UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES</u> drop out of the race: "I have finished the race"

Be remembered as one who deliberately ran all the way of your life with Jesus.

SAY NO to compromise the faith: "I have kept the faith"

Be remembered as one who didn't <u>compromise</u> the faith and was faithful to God to the end!

3. What Kind Of REWARD Will You Receive? (vs. 8)

- Paul wanted to go to HOME in Heaven.
- Paul was ready to meet the LORD, "the righteous Judge".

Be remembered as one who looked forward going to Heaven and receiving rewards from $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$

Give Your All to God and Let Him Mold Your Life.

Give Him your many years to serve Him, let God have everything. It's never too late to be what you might have been!
